



Most cited paper in *Journal of Psychopharmacology*

SAGE Publications will be sponsoring an annual prize for the most cited paper that is published in *Journal of Psychopharmacology*. This calculation will be made from data supplied by the Institute of Scientific Information (ISI), based on the most recent citation analysis available.

The winner of the **2007 SAGE Prize for the Most Cited Paper in *Journal of Psychopharmacology*** is as follows:

How the prize calculation works:

- ✍ The calculations will include all articles published in *Journal of Psychopharmacology*, **only** excluding the BAP Guidelines, which are not eligible for this prize.
- ✍ The winning article will be the article with the highest number of overall citations made in the previous year from articles published within the past five years. Therefore, the 2007 prize is presented to a paper which had the highest level of citations in 2006 from articles published in the Journal between 2001 and 2006. Next year's evaluation will be on the most highly cited in 2007 from articles published since 2002.
- ✍ If more than one article receives the same level of citations, the prize will be split accordingly.
- ✍ If the same article wins two years running, the prize will be awarded to the second placed article.

**The prize will be a £500 voucher to spend on SAGE products
which may be shared amongst the contributing authors.**
