### Call for Editor-in-Chief Therapeutic Advances in Psychopharmacology

*Therapeutic Advances in Psychopharmacology* is a new peer-reviewed medical journal that SAGE Publications Ltd will be launching in affiliation with the British Association of Psychopharmacology in late 2010. Together with the *Journal of Psychopharmacology*, we will extend our publishing coverage to ensure a greater number of original research and review articles are published more rapidly, and this may also include interesting cases and educational articles. The new journal will focus primarily on medicines and their place in therapy - in the whole range of psychiatric diseases.

**The BAP invites suitable persons from the BAP membership to apply for the position of Editor-in-Chief.** The ideal candidate will be someone with a highly regarded track record in relevant research, connections with clinicians and industry worldwide, and a participant at key international and UK conferences. A team of respected Associate Editors and an International Editorial Board will also be appointed to support the Editor-in-Chief with ideas for review articles, and in the peer-review process.

The time commitment is not onerous and involves providing direction on the journal and, using our online submission system, delegating peer review and making final decisions on manuscripts. The Editor-in-Chief will work closely with the SAGE Managing Editor who has an active commissioning role and also ensures flow of manuscripts is sufficient for each issue. The Managing Editor will also liaise with the Editor-in-Chief and Associates on ideas for future articles. Thus, the incumbent would be required to reply promptly to emails sent from our online submission system and to correspondence sent to him as part of the role. This may take anything from 5 to 30 minutes in any day depending on workflow. The Editor-in-Chief will also be expected to attend a journal meeting at scheduled BAP meetings, and there will of course be the opportunity for ongoing stimulating discussion with the Editor-in-Chief of *Journal of Psychopharmacology*. Although we intend to launch later this year, we would like to recruit the Editor-in-Chief as soon as possible for online training, help with editorial board recruitment, and to develop the scope and content of the journal. An annual stipend is given, and will be discussed at interview.
